



I am no stranger to the world of aviation. When my parents divorced, I spent my fair share of time traveling across the U.S. This is where I received my first pair of wings, not from the Air Force but from a flight attendant comforting me at the age of 8 after leaving Dad's to head back home. That flight would spark the drive I have for the world of aviation. For me, a

flight of 4 hours felt like minutes as my mind surged with the inspiration sparked by that attendant showing an act of kindness. At 18 I enlisted in the Air Force chasing a new wing as a career enlisted aviator. I earned my second pair of wings as a Boom Operator on the KC-135. After learning the ropes at my home station and flying over 30 combat missions overseas, I set my eyes new wings. After spending so many hours on the road with pilots, I knew I wanted to join their ranks. I planned my path carefully, starting college to complete my Batchelor's degree. Within a year of starting college, I was given a rare opportunity to build an airframe from the ground up. I looked to challenge myself by switching platforms to the KC-46 and the experience I would further my pursuit of pilot wings.

My name is Jeremiah Guinto, and I am a Staff Sergeant in the U.S Air Force at Edwards AFB. I grew up six hours north from Edwards in Daly City. California. with my wife, dog, and we are expecting a baby girl. I am a tanker test boom operator working on the KC-135 and new systems for the KC-46 tanker. As a test boom operator, student and husband, I am driven by responsibility to deliver excellent performance in all I do for the United States Air Force, my fellow personnel and to provide for my family as we prepare for our new family member. My goal is to complete my bachelor's degree, become an instructor/evaluator as a test boom operator and to be a responsible father.

So, they dropped out of school. environment. Throughout my tenure, I mentored, taught and sometimes acted as a therapist to those kids. After four years, I witnessed a major shift in some while there were others who continued down the wrong path. Regardless of which direction, I was able to empathize as I too grew up in a low-income environment. The only difference between where I am now and where some of the people I grew up with can be boiled down to one thing: Education. This is why I am in pursuit of a Master's Degree so I can continue to learn, grow and open more doors. This time, I want to emphasize the importance of education to my three children, like my mother did for me. I want them to see how education can change their lives.



"If you fail to prepare, prepare to fail." That's a line I recall my father repeating to me throughout my adolescent years, and it has stuck with me. Born in Brooklyn, New York to a mother Jamaican and а Trinidadian-Grenadian father, I was taught early on the value of education, self-worth and growth.
