Flight Test Nation 2009

Tremendous Success!

Men and Women of the Air Force Flight Test Center,

What a day - a clear blue sky with calm winds! A perfect day for an air show!

So much preparation went into this event, where do I start? Security? Maintenance? Medical? Operations? Civil Engineering? Protocol? Public Affairs? The AFFTC Museum? The Civ-Mil Group? Safety? Finance? Communications? Scaled Composites? National Test Pilot School? NASA? All the local communities that issued proclamations of unequivocal support? It took the best out of all of them and their best was what they delivered! Now, so many to thank - so hard, no, it's impossible to find the right words but I have to try!



The eager public, over 200,000 in total, lined up early and our security forces were ready for them. They started early and they went very late to ensure our guests got off the base safely. The parking plan was executed extremely well and even better were the adaptations that happened real-time as an anxious public was backed up all the way to the highways, north and west. We did our level best to expedite the flow but so many people knew how great Flight Test Nation 2009 was going to be that some lengthy delays were inevitable. So we adapted again and extended the hours of the open house to 1700 so those that gave effort to be here could enjoy it for a while.

And enjoy they did! You didn't have to be on the ramp to hear the Edwards trademark opening sonic boom! At precisely 10 o'clock, Brigadier General "Chuck" Yeager and Major General Joe Engle sent a shock wave to the ground from 30,00 feet, high overhead! Where else does that happen?

Once on the ramp, the public was exposed to what I believe was the greatest collection of aircraft ever amassed at an airshow! The F-35 Lightning II made it's airshow debut! The White Knight II flew by and was put on static display next to it older brother White Knight I. National Test Pilot School at Mojave brought over some of their aircraft and Global Hawk was basking in the public glow

as well. There was a long line of people to go through the NASA Shuttle Carrier Boeing 747. All this and our regular stable of aircraft which includes Raptors, Talons, Vipers, BUFFs, BONEs, Spirits, Hornets, Eagles, etc, etc, etc. All Edwards has to do to have a great show is open the hangar doors but we did so much more!

The public was also privileged to witness the enlistment ceremony for about 200 Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Marines! I officiated the oath of enlistment and was joined on stage by a multi-service honor guard, and representatives from each of

Everyone made this day the success it was but I have to give special thanks to the medics who took care of people overcome by the sun/heat. With so many

2009 Edwards AFB Open House & Air Show: Flight Test Nation

What a day for an air show! It had been 2006 since Edwards AFB hosted an open house and air show. But with Flight Test Nation on Saturday, October 17, 2009, over 200,000 attendees visited the base and viewed numerous aircraft and weapons systems on the ground and in the air. It was a superb day for flying, and there was flying – a lot of flying. There were aerial displays from heritage aircraft such as the B-17, B-25, P-38, and P-51. Modern day aircraft such as the B-1, B-2, C-17, F-16, and F-22 thrilled everyone. Even the unique White Knight II, built by Mojave's Scaled Composites for Virgin Galactic, flew for the crowd before landing and joining up on the ramp with the original White Knight aircraft.

Other airborne entertainment was provided by the US Army's Golden Knights parachute team. The aerial production of Tora! Tora! Tora! offered vintage American and Japanese aircraft with plenty of explosive effects.

There was plenty on the ground to interest everyone. Visitors were able to tour through some of the largest aircraft on the flightline such as the C-17 Globemaster III transport and NASA's 747 Shuttle Carrier Aircraft. The wings and shadows of these huge planes and the B-52, B-1, KC-135 provided relief from the sun for many.

The AFFTC Museum's freshly painted SR-71 Blackbird – always impressive – joined the other aircraft stretched along the flightline. The Marine Corps' CH-46 Sea Stallion, Boeing's X-48B Blended Wing Body (BWB) dem-

onstrator, Northrop-Grumman's X-47B Unmanned Combat Aircraft for the US Navy, NASA's Predator B 'Ikhana'



UAV, and Lockheed-Martin's F-35 Lightning II Joint Strike Fighter – all part of the Edwards AFB "airscape" were proudly on display and drawing much interest. All of the aforementioned aircraft plus so many more made this a very special event.

Adding to the day was the outstanding food and drink provided by the various flight test squadrons, units, and organizations that make up Edwards AFB.

Major General Eichhorn hosted the Commander's Hospitality Tent. Our very own Edwards AFB Civ-Mil Support Group, in partnership with the William J. "Pete" Knight Chapter of the Air Force Association, made this possible



with the gracious support of aerospace contractors, local businesses, community organizations, and individuals. This area was where base leadership, community leaders, elected officials, and friends of the General and AFFTC leaders could socialize together in a covered environment, watch the action in the air and on the runway, enjoy refreshments, and just plain seek a place to rest for a bit after walking up and down the flightline. Guests had an opportunity to mingle with some aviation luminaries such as Chuck Yeager and Joe Engle.


